### MINUTES OF REGULAR MEETING OF DOWNTOWN REDEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY

January 10, 2012

The Board of Directors (the "Board") of Downtown Redevelopment Authority (the "Authority") convened in regular session, open to the public, at the offices of Houston Downtown Management District, on the 10th day of January 2012, and the roll was called of the duly constituted officers and members of the Board, to-wit:

and all of said persons were present except Directors Hamm, Odom, and Lampley, thus constituting a quorum.

Franks of 806 Main; Sloan Holly of Pearl Hospitality; Tom McCasland of the Houston Parks Board; Karen Mulville of Houston Pavilions; Leslie Garvis and Brian Keene of FMG Design; Veda Graves of Lockwood, Andrews, and Newman ("LAN"); Captain Bryan Bennett of the Houston Police Department; and Michele Swayzer of Swayzer Engineering, Inc.

#### **DETERMINE QUORUM; CALL TO ORDER**

Chair Peña noted that a quorum was present and called the meeting to order.

#### INTRODUCTION OF GUESTS AND PUBLIC COMMENTS

Chair Peña introduced and welcomed the new director, Barry Mandel to the Board. The meeting attendees next introduced themselves to the Board.

#### **APPROVE MINUTES OF PREVIOUS MEETINGS**

The Board considered approving the minutes of the November 8, 2011 meeting. Following discussion, upon a motion made by Director Flowers and seconded by Director Keyser, the Board voted unanimously to approve the minutes as presented.

#### **FINANCIAL REPORT**

#### **Check Register**

Ms. Derby reported that the Budget and Finance Committee approved the check register and recommended full approval by the Board. Following discussion, upon a motion made by Director Keyser and seconded by Director Sabino, the Board voted unanimously to approve the check register as presented. A copy of the check register is attached to these minutes.

#### Financial Status Report

Mr. Baugh presented the financial status and investment reports for the periods ending October 31, 2011 and November 30, 2011, copies of which are attached to these minutes. Following discussion, upon a motion made by Director McNiel and seconded by Director Keyser the Board voted unanimously to approve the financial status and investment reports as presented.

#### Refunding of Series 2002A and 2009 Contract Tax Increment Revenue Bonds

Ms. Derby updated the Board on the status of the bond refunding transaction. She requested that the Board authorize the engagement of all consultants listed on the distribution list. Mr. Lord next discussed the financing schedule. Following discussion, upon a motion made by Director Sabino and seconded by Director Keyser, the Board voted unanimously to engage the consultants listed on the attached distribution list for the refunding of the Series 2002A and Series 2009 Bonds.

#### MUNICIPAL SERVICE/HPD OVERTIME PROGRAM

Captain Bennett presented the municipal services report.

#### PARKS AND RECREATIONAL FACILITIES IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS

#### Market Square Park

Ms. Derby reported that the dinning trellis has not provided sufficient coverage from the elements and will require redesign and construction to further improve its use. She informed the Board that the item would be presented at the next meeting with the to engage the Houston Downtown Management District.

#### Houston Parks Board Buffalo Bayou Hike/Bike/Pedestrian connectivity project

Mr. McCasland reported that the TIGER III grant was not approved, noting, however, that the City of Houston received a good briefing on its application. He next stated that the

Houston Parks Board will resubmit its application for TIGER IV. Mr. McCasland requested to meet with the Economic Development Committee soon to discuss the next grant application.

#### Leadership Houston's project for enhancements to green space within the Zone

Mr. Colom discussed Leadership Houston's Triangle Park project. He stated that he wanted to update the Board on this project to ensure that there is no duplication with any current projects within the Downtown zone. Following discussion, no Board action was required.

#### **ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT PROJECTS**

#### **Houston Pavilions**

Ms. Mulville reported that Houston Pavilions hired Bryan Keene of FMG Design to begin work on the design of the Dallas Street improvements. Mr. Keene next presented several design improvements for Dallas Street to the Board. Discussion next ensued on the cost for the improvements and Ms. Mulville stated that Houston Pavilions is going to give approximately \$20,000 to the tenants to improve their patios and that the balance will be used for the remaining improvements. Ms. Derby and Mr. Lord indicated that the Board needed to see a written agreement for the improvements that is in line with the Authority's agreement with the Houston Pavilions. Mr. Lord next stated that the Board can authorize the Economic Development Committee to approve the formal plan.

Following discussion, upon a motion made by Director Sabino and seconded by Director Flowers, the Board voted unanimously to authorize the Economic Development Committee to approve the concept of the plan and finalize same.

Additional matters concerning this item were further discussed in executive session.

#### Comcast/NBC Universal Studios

This item was discussed in executive session.

#### Buffalo Bayou Park

Mr. Lord updated the Board on the status of the final Maintenance and Operations Agreement, noting that the agreement stayed in line with the term sheet presented at the prior meeting.

#### City of Houston Housing and Community Development

Mr. Rackleff discussed the enhanced enterprise community status and enterprise zone program and the funding options available for applicants. He requested \$49,500 from the Board to hire a consultant who has worked on many of the enterprise zone funding transactions. He further explained the scope of services noting the consultant would analyze the eligibility of the 806 Main project for bridge funding and apply to the Department of Housing and Urban Development ("HUD") to extend the life of the program before it expires in August 2012.

This item was further discussed in executive session.

Following discussion, upon a motion made by Director McNiel and seconded by Director Keyser, the Board voted unanimously to approve \$49,500 for the consultant to explore 806 Main project for eligibility, restructure and extend the HUD Section 108 program.

#### WALKWAY AND STREETSCAPE IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS

#### East West Streets

Ms. Graves presented a proposal for a design amendment to accommodate the proposed planned development along Bell Street, noting a cost of \$12,747 for the additional services. Following discussion on the design amendment, upon a motion made by Director Keyser and seconded by Director Flowers, the Board voted unanimously to approve the design amendment and the additional costs in the amount of \$12,747.

Ms. Graves next discussed awarding the construction contract. She stated that five contractors submitted bids and that Jerdon Enterprise, L.P. submitted the lowest bid in the amount of \$1,567,567.67. Following discussion on the contract award, upon a motion made by Director Flowers and seconded by Director McNiel, the Board voted unanimously to award the contract to Jerdon Enterprise, L.P. for the sidewalk construction.

Ms. Derby submitted the CenterPoint Energy proposal for decorative streetlight pole and construction costs in the amount of \$55,136 for the Board's review and approval. Following discussion, upon a motion made by Director Keyser and seconded by Director Sabino, the Board voted unanimously to approve the CenterPoint Energy proposal in the amount of \$55,136.

Ms. Derby next presented the invoices related to the design costs for the Board's review an approval. Following discussion, upon a motion made by Director Keyser and seconded by Director Sabino, the Board voted unanimously to approve the invoices related to the design costs.

#### Southeast Sidewalk

Ms. Derby requested that the Board ratify approval of the Texas Department of Transportation ("TXDOT") Sponsorship Agreement with the City of Houston. Following discussion, upon a motion made by Director Keyser and seconded by Director Flowers, the Board voted unanimously to ratify approval of the TXDOT Sponsorship Agreement under the terms originally presented to the Board.

#### **HOUSTON DOWNTOWN MANAGEMENT DISTRICT**

Ms. Bertinot updated the Board on the Houston Downtown Management District's retail and marketing efforts. Mr. Hoogeboom next reported that he is working with METRO for the Capital/Rusk Street design competition.

#### **ADMINISTRATIVE**

#### Assignment of legal services

Mr. Lord next reported that the public finance section at Vinson & Elkins LLP is moving to Bracewell & Giuliani and discussed the transition process. Following discussion, upon a motion made by Director Sabino and seconded by Director Flowers, the Board voted unanimously to authorize i) Bracewell & Giuliani to begin to represent the Authority and Zone once Mr. Lord joins Bracewell & Giuliani on the same terms and conditions as the engagement of Vinson & Elkins; ii) the transfer of files as necessary; and iii) to continue its engagement with Vinson & Elkins until the transition process is complete.

#### **Committee Appointments**

Ms. Derby discussed the committee proposal. She noted the proposed committee appointments are as follows: Economic Development Committee – Directors Keyser, Hamm, Mandel, and Peña; Budget and Finance Committee – Directors Flowers, Keyser, McNiel, and Peña; Housing Committee – Directors Odom, Sabino, Lampley, and Mandel; Personnel Committee – Directors Sabino, Keyser, Lampley, and Peña; and Executive Committee – Directors Peña, Lampley, Keyser, and Flowers.

Following discussion, upon a motion made by Director Sabino and seconded by Director Flowers, the Board voted unanimously to approve the committee changes as presented.

#### **EXECUTIVE SESSION**

The Board went into executive session at 2:17 p.m. pursuant to Sections 551.071 and 551.087 of the Texas Government code to consult with their attorney and discuss economic development negotiation issues in connection with the Houston Pavilions, Comcast/NBC Universal Studios, and the grant for HUD Section 108 loan program consultant. Present for executive session were the following: all present Board members noted in these minutes, Mr. Lord, Ms. Davis, Mr. Douglass, Ms. Capps, and Ms. Derby.

### RECONVENE IN OPEN SESSION AND TAKE ACTION ON MATTERS DISCUSSED IN EXECUTIVE SESSION

The Board reconvened in open session at approximately 2:54 p.m. Following discussion on matters discussed in executive session, the Board took action on the HUD Section 108 loan program under the economic development projects item.

#### **NEXT MEETING**

Chair Peña reported that the next meeting will occur on February 14, 2012.

There being no further business to come before the Board, the meeting was adjourned.
